Biography:

John has over 30 years experience, the first twenty practicing in New York City where he became Project & Design Director for the original Trump Tower. Appointed a Partner at Swanke Hayden Connell Architects in 1983, he subsequently directed project teams for a variety of residential, institutional, commercial, and retail projects including America's Tower, Brooklyn Union Gas Company HQ (now Keyspan Energy), Seaport Plaza/Prudential-Bache HQ, The Pierre Condominium, and the historic restoration of the original Bowery Savings Bank designed by McKim, Mead & White and built in 1895.

Recruited to North Carolina in 1996 his work included: a multi-purpose Events & Exhibit Hall for the North Carolina State Fair, a Visitors Education & Orientation Center for the US National Arboretum in Washington, DC., modernization of Williams Cafeteria at North Carolina A&T State University, and a new conference/exhibit center for the Georgia National Fair. He also directed the team that developed a master plan for the 43 acre Greensboro Campus of the Guilford Technical Community College, and he designed their Technical Education Center. Other projects included the modernization of Cameron Indoor Stadium at Duke University, the North American Production Facility for Poppies Inc. (a Belgian based manufacturer of frozen desserts), and the Student Center Expansion for the University of North Carolina Wilmington.

Having spent many years of his career in the traditional practice of architecture, in 2004 John joined Neumann Homes in Chicago as V.P. of Community Design. His primary responsibility in this position was to lead the design team for a community of 2100 homes based on the principles of New Urbanism and Traditional Neighborhood Design. The project included a wide range of housing types for a variety of income levels and a town center with retail and civic building components. Neumann Homes was unfortunately one of the early casualties of the current home building industry crisis. Because the project could not go forward, he left Neumann Homes and almost immediately was asked to join Perry Bigelow, Founder of Bigelow Homes (Professional Builder Magazine's Builder of the Year in 2005) as Director of Design in March 2006. With Bigelow he was responsible for planning and design of a variety of attached and detached single family homes, as well as future mixed-use communities which employed TND principles established by founder Perry Bigelow. He also served as Town Architect for Home Town Aurora, the signature development of the Bigelow Group.

John has served as an adjunct faculty member of the New York University Real Estate Institute, has lectured at both Harvard University Graduate School of Design and the Columbia University Graduate School of Business. He was a guest instructor at the North Carolina State University School of Architecture. He has presented continuing education programs on "project management" the American Institute of Architects National Convention, the AIA South Atlantic Regional Conference, and the AIA Wisconsin Convention.
